Academic Regalia

Please review this guide to wearing your academic regalia as you prepare for the commencement activities. All faculty who are participating in commencement and candidates for graduation are required to wear the exact academic regalia for their degree (gown, cap, hood, and tassel). Due to the formality of this occasion and safety concerns regarding walking on the steps and stage, please wear appropriate footwear; flip flops, clogs and loose fitting shoes are not recommended. In addition, it is requested that men wear slacks and a dress shirt with tie. For women, slacks with a blouse, or a dress is appropriate for the ceremony. Flowers, corsages, and balloons should not be carried or worn during the academic procession and commencement ceremony. Student Eligibility

Students eligible to participate in the 2013 Commencement Ceremony include August 2012 graduates, December 2012 graduates, and potential May 2013 graduates. BALS and MPS students who are within 6 credits of completing their coursework, and plan to complete them in the upcoming Summer 2013 semester, may also be eligible to participate in the Commencement Ceremony. Due to intensive thesis review and approval requirements, MALS and DLS students must have completed all required credits *and* have received formal thesis approval to participate in the Commencement Ceremony. Only the names of students expected to complete their coursework by the end of the Spring 2013 semester, and students who completed their coursework in August 2012 or December 2012, will be printed in the

2013 Commencement Book. Students graduating in August 2013 or December 2013 will have their names printed in the 2014 Commencement Book.

When is the SCS Commencement Ceremony?

Is the Reception open to family and friends?

Yes. A Reception follows the Commencement Ceremony at 5:00 p.m. in theLeo J. O'Donovan Dining Hall. Food and drinks will be provided.

The ceremony lasts approximately 90 minutes. A Reception follows at 5:00 p.m. in the Leo J. O'Donovan Dining Hall. Food and drinks will be provided.

I'm a student-how do I purchase my graduation regalia?

In order to participate in the Commencement Ceremony, students must be dressed in the correct academic regalia. We suggest wearing business casual attire under your gowns. As part of your attire, we highly recommend wearing shirts or blouses with a button-up collar, which helps keep your hood in place.

- The hood for the Doctor of Liberal Studies degree has a wide band of white velvet on a black hood. The doctoral gown has horizontal black velvet stripes on the sleeves.

Cap and gown rental is not offered for students.

I'm a student—can I purchase regalia without visiting the campus bookstore? <u>In order to participate in the Commencement Ceremony, students must be dressed in the correct</u> <u>academic regalia.</u> We suggest wearing business casual attire under your gowns. As part of your attire, we <u>highly recommend</u> wearing shirts or blouses with a button-up collar, which helps keep your hood in place.

I'm a faculty member-how do purchase my graduation regalia?

The Director of Events will be reaching out to all faculty shortly with rental directions for graduation regalia. The Dean's office has agreed to pay for faculty rental regalia this year. Please note, however, that if a member of your faculty does not return their regalia, your department will be billed.

When do I pick-up graduation announcements?

Each student receives 10 graduation announcements free of charge (these are generic and do not include your name). Students can pick these up after April 1 from their program manager or director. Students will receive an email directly from their programs with specific information regarding pick-up.

When should my family and friends arrive to Healy Lawn?

Commencement Ceremony seating is on a first-come, first-served basis. Seating will begin after the conclusion of the Business School's 12:30 p.m. ceremony (approximately 2:00-2:30 p.m.), which is before SCS's ceremony. There are plenty of seats on Healy Lawn to accommodate everyone's guests, and in the event of rain there are plenty of seats in McDonough Arena. All guests should be in their seats by the start of the procession at 3:15 p.m.

What will the weather be like?

The weather in Washington, D.C. in May is often warm and humid. There is also chance of rain. All guests should dress appropriately and bring an umbrella in the event of rain.

I have a difficult last name-how can I ensure it is pronounced correctly?

When students arrive on Commencement day, they will be given a note card on which to write their name phonetically. They will hand this card to the announcer before they cross the stage.

When do I get my diploma?

Diplomas will be distributed in-person immediately following the Commencement Ceremony. If students do not pick-up their diploma on Commencement day, it will be mailed to them. A specific pick-up location is TBA.

Who is our graduation speaker?

Georgetown University announces all graduation speakers through the Office of Communications. This announcement is made in early May.

Where should people park during Commencement weekend?

Parking during Commencement weekend is challenging. Please review the following for tips on parking and traveling to campus:http://commencement.georgetown.edu/travel-and-parking/

There is limited handicapped parking in the Southwest Quad garage. When possible, guests should drop off their handicapped family member close to the Commencement site and then park the car. There will also be a shuttle bus for handicapped attendees running continuously from the main gate to various sections of campus all day on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.

Do you provide wheelchairs or handicapped seating during the Commencement Ceremony? Yes. Wheelchairs are provided free of charge during graduation. Students will need to RSVP via the online survey,https://www.surveymonkey.com/s/RSVPCommencement2013, if a family member or friend requires wheelchair rental during the ceremony. There is a reserved seating section for wheelchairs (Healy Lawn: on the audience right side of the stage closest to Healy Circle; McDonough Arena: on the audience's left side by the bleachers and the band). Each guest requiring a wheelchair can bring <u>one</u> attendee with them to this section.

How will I know if there is a rain call?
