CURRICULUM

The master's in Project Management is a focused degree that incorporates both the technical and leadership skills needed to differentiate project managers in today's global and digital world. Students may enroll in the program on either a full-time or part-time basis. To earn the degree, students must successfully complete 30 credits (10 courses).
