COURSE INFORMATION

Course Description

This course is intended for student comprehension of Persian intermediate level I. Classes will be conducted entirely in the target language. All aspects of the Persian language will be studied and practiced, to include: speaking, listening comprehension, reading comprehension and writing.

The course incorporates a variety of activities and drills including dialogues, reading texts, role plays, language games, grammar and phonetic exercises, dictations, translations, interviews and discussion of topics.

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By the end of this course, students will be able to participate in a simple conversation (15-20 minutes) as well as write simple text (250–300 words).

All composition assignments will be written or typed during the class hours, unless otherwise indicated by the instructor. Grammar exercises and other assignments (such as oral presentations) are to be prepared out of class hours; they must be the individual student's work without any outside help in any form other than dictionaries and grammar books.
