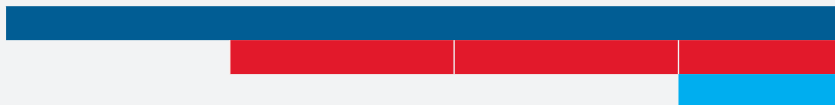

COLLEGE CREDIT COURSES

These five-week undergraduate courses offer the opportunity to explore exciting fields of study and earn official academic credit. Choose from a wide selection of subject areas in courses that range from introductory Fundamentals courses to the advanced Summer Honors Intensive program.

Session I: June 5–July 8, 2016

Session II: July 10–August 12, 2016

Fundamental/Intro Courses

(Take one class per session; earn up to six credits)

Explore a specific subject area in these comprehensive, five-week introductory courses. Featuring a blend of lectures, class discussions, and hands-on application, the Fundamentals courses provide a seamless transition into the college learning environment.

Summer Honors Intensive

(Take two classes per session; earn up to 12 credits)

Highly motivated high school students who are seeking a rigorous academic experience are encouraged to take two courses per session. Over the course of the summer, you will have the opportunity to take classes alongside undergraduate students, study a wide breadth of stimulating subjects, and get ahead on your college studies.



SUBJECT AREAS

Arts & Humanities

From drawing and creative writing to philosophy and European history, these stimulating courses will exercise your imagination and expand your horizons.

Business & Law

Gain valuable insights into the business world and explore the social, political, economical, and cultural factors that influence the creation of laws in these comprehensive courses.

Medicine & Science

Featuring topics that range from human anatomy and infectious diseases to chemistry and psychology, these courses immerse you in the fascinating world of science and medicine.

Politics & Foreign Policy

Engage with D.C. experts to gain firsthand insights about the presidency, Congress, political parties, international affairs, public opinion, and more.



Student Life

During the day, you will attend lectures, work on projects, or prepare for exams, while in the evenings, the high school community comes together for various activities ranging from movies and game nights to cookouts and concerts. Outside of class, you will also have the opportunity to attend co-curricular evening programming, such as lecture series and mini courses, as well as Residential Living programs, which include off-campus outings, social events, and weekend trips.

Housing & Commuting Options

All students participating in our Summer High School Programs will have the opportunity to live on the historic Georgetown University Hilltop campus. However, certain programs also provide the option to live at home and commute to campus.

Prestigious Faculty

Georgetown's world-class faculty members bring their extensive scholarship and real-world experience directly into the classroom. Engage with former diplomats, public health officials, economists, scientists, and experts across a wide breadth of professions while developing the expanded knowledge and leadership skills needed for future success.

As a student in our programs, you will have the opportunity to experience the vibrant surroundings of D.C.—from museums and monuments, movies on the lawn, and baseball games to outdoor festivals and countless unique attractions.
