WHAT IS A TITLE IX COORDINATOR?

The Title IX Coordinator ensures nondiscrimination and compliance with Title IX. which includes the University's response to sexual misconduct.

IF UNSURE OF A PROFESSIONAL'S CONFIDENTIALITY. ASK THE INDIVIDUAL FOR CLARIFICATION.

UNIVERSITY TITLE IX PROCESS

You share as much or as little information as you want with a Title IX Coordinator.

You have access to a Title IX Coordinator who can arrange academic and protective interim measures (academic assistance, housing relocation, etc.)

You can receive an overview of Student Conduct procedures from a Title IX Coordinator.

IF YOU WANT GEORGETOWN TO INVESTIGATE

A Title IX Coordinator will connect you with Student Conduct to file a formal complaint. The investigation will be conducted by a trained Title IX investigator. A hearing will determine the outcome.

IF YOU DO NOT WANT GEORGETOWN TO INVESTIGATE

If there is no community safety concern, the process ends. All of the interim measures can remain intact. In the rare instance that there is a community safety concern, the case may move forward in the investigative process without the complainant.
